He also completes the house closings for our Habitat family partners. His efforts serve to protect HFHNA and the donor/seller of each property with the Partner Family. His efforts benefit to the entire CSRA community.

Donald H. White has been a resident of the North Augusta community for more than 44 years. In fact he graduated from North Augusta high school in 1976 with honors. There is a reason for his tenacity of a bulldog in insuring each property is free and clear. He is a graduate of the University of Georgia where he earned his Bachelor's Degree in 1980 but he didn't stop there. He continued his education and received his Jurist Doctor Degree in 1984 also from the University of Georgia. Truly a Georgia Bulldog at heart! He has been practicing law in both South Carolina and Georgia for about 30 years with offices in North Augusta and Augusta. Homeowner Eligibility Requirements

Although eligibility requirements can vary from city to city below are some basic eligibility requirements:

- Applicants must have a gross annual household income based on HUD guidelines.
 - \$11,180 to \$22,360 for a family of 2
 - \$12,577 to \$25,155 for a family of 3
 - \$13,975 to \$27,950 for a family of 4
 - \$15,093 to \$30,186 for a family of 5
 - \$16,211 to \$32,422 for a family of 6
 - \$17,329 to \$34,658 for a family of 7
 - \$18,447 to \$36,894 for a family of 8
- Applicants must have rented for the past 6-12 months depending on the city where Habitat houses are available.
- At least one adult applicant in your family must have legal permanent residency or citizenship in the United States at the time of the application.
- Applicants must have steady income, fair credit and a minimal level of debt.
- Applicants and their family must be willing to perform "sweat equity" (amount of hours depends on the family size and could be as high as 500 hours.)
- Applicants must have not owned or co-owned a home in the last 3 years.

One of the final things we do is put the house numbers on the front of the house. It was one of the last things Jim did on his last day at Habitat. One of our members thought it was a fitting way for Jim to close out his time with Habitat and it is something we will remember every time we pass the house.

Jim had one final thing to do for Habitat before he left to head north for the last time. He contacted a Habitat member to offer some of his tools as a donation to the continuing work of Habitat for Humanity.
