Family Selection Process

"What's the process for selecting families for a Habitat house" is one of the most common questions we receive. Habitat for Humanity of North Augusta (HfHNA) has ongoing efforts throughout the year to search for qualified homeowners—there is no restricted window for applying.

We place ads in the local paper and in our monthly newsletter, an application is on our web site; and we also participate throughout the year in community events and communicate with local churches to further our efforts in soliciting applications. In recent years, approximately 15 applications are received each year. The applications go through a screening by the Family Selection Committee, then a further screening by our mortgage servicing and financial counseling partner at Security Federal Bank.

The qualified families are selected based primarily on need. Next, our family partner must have a decent credit rating and be able to afford the mortgage payment (which is a zero percent interest mortgage

held by us). They also must be willing to work a required number of hours, based on family size, on their house—sweat equity.

The Family Selection Committee Chair and one or two other board members make home visits to each qualified applicant and determine who has the biggest need based on home conditions.

Recommendations are made to the board and a vote is taken to determine the next owner/partner. Habitat for Humanity of North Augusta, in concert with our sponsors and donors, are always looking for a family living in sub-standard conditions to move into a decent and affordable house.

Hard work is a central theme in any Habitat for Humanity of North Augusta project. The organization does not give homes away; it gives help to those willing to do their share. All Partner Families are required to provide as much as 500 sweat equity hours and meet homeowner eligibility requirements to qualify as a candidate.
