Habitat for Humanity of North Augusta, unlike many other affiliates, is a 100% volunteer organization which includes the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors is comprised of several ex-business people with managerial skills both in the private sector and with not-for-profit entities making up a well rounded cadre of individuals who volunteer their time to pursue HFHNA's mission. Approximately 93% of every dollar received from Sponsors and Donors goes directly into the build of a house. This year will mark the beginning of House 17 which is

planned for completion in the fall of 2016. We are currently seeking additional Sponsors for House 17. Many people believe Habitat for Humanity "gives" houses away which is not accurate. The Habitat Partner must meet several basic requirements to be considered as a candidate to be awarded a house with an interest free mortgage. Although eligibility requirements can vary from time to time below are some basic eligibility requirements:

- Applicants must have a gross annual household income based on HUD guidelines.
 - \$12,400 to \$22,733 for a family of 2
 - \$13,950 to \$25,575 for a family of 3
 - \$15,500 to \$28,416 for a family of 4
 - \$16,700 to \$30,616 for a family of 5
 - \$19,200 to \$32,908 for a family of 6
 - \$19,200 to \$35,200 for a family of 7
 - \$20,450 to \$37,491 for a family of 8
- Applicants must have rented for the past 6-12 months
- At least one adult applicant in the family must have legal permanent residency or citizenship in the United States at the time of the application.
- Applicants must have steady income, fair credit and a minimal level of debt.
- Applicants and their family must be **willing and able to perform "sweat equity" (amount of hours depends on the family size and could be as high as 500 hours.)**
- Applicants must have not owned or co-owned a home in the last 3 years.
